## God is Omniscient: He Knows Everything!

Exodus 32:1-8

Verse to Memorize: Psalm 86:8 There is none like you, O Lord.

Catechism Question: What is God? God is the creator of everyone and everything.

Session	Activity	Materials Needed
Welcome and Greeting	Greet students and discuss their week. Spend time building relationships.	
Music	<p>Share with students that we will be having music time every week. We will be learning a song that helps us remember and learn our lesson. For the next 8 weeks we will be learning the question <b>What is God?</b> We will be singing a song to help us learn the answer to that question!</p> <p>Using New City Catechism App go to Question 2: What is God? Play Song for Question 2: What is God</p> <p>Lyrics: God is the creator of everyone and everything.</p>	<p>Download APP: New City Catechism</p> 
Memory Verse Game/Activity	Have kids sit in a circle. Begin to clap in a rhythm. As you clap say one word of the verse at a time. Say the verse in a normal voice a few times so students get the rhythm. Then have students clap and say the verse in a whisper voice. Then have students clap and say the verse in a silly voice. Say the verse in a loud voice. Say the verse in a high pitch voice. Then end by saying the verse in your normal voice!	<a href="#">Memory Verse Page</a>

Catechism and Lesson	<p>Discuss with students that over the next 4 weeks they are going to be continuing to learn the answer to the question <b>What is God?</b> Each week we will think about the answer the that question: <b>God is the creator of everyone and everything.</b> God is the creator of everyone and everything so He has special parts of himself that we do not have. Does anyone remember what we have learned so far about what God has that we do not have? Allow students to share about the attributes of God that they have learned about so far.</p> <p>This week we are learning about how God knows everything. Repeat that after me- God knows everything. Now show students the motion that goes with the word by taking your fingers and tapping your head. God knows everything. (repeat the word with the motion a few times and allow students to repeat it to each other.)</p> <p>Do you know everything? Do you know anyone who knows everything? Well God knows everything! Let's read in the bible about how God knows everything! (Repeat the motion.)</p> <p>Open your bible to Exodus 32:1-8 to show students where to find the story of the Israelites Read the following child friendly version.</p> <p>God had just brought the Israelites out of Egypt and they knew he is the one who led them. But Moses, their leader, went up onto the mountain to talk to God and was taking a long time. The people started getting impatient and said, "let's make a god to lead us" so they took their gold and they made a calf to worship. Then they said</p>	
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	<p>“These are your gods who brought you from Egypt” and they worshiped the calf”</p> <p>And God spoke to Moses on the mountain and said “Go, get down there. In no time the people have started worshipping something other than me!”</p> <p>Oh no! God protected the Israelites and look what happened. They chose to show love and worship something else. A golden calf that they made! They forgot how good God was to them. Look at what God told Moses: “Go, Get Down There!” The Israelites were messing up and worshipping other gods, and God knew they were doing that, but that didn’t mean he was going to give up on them. Even though God knew they were doing something wrong, he still stayed with them and lead them.</p>	
<p>Missional Moment</p>	<p>Discuss how each week we will have a missional moment where we discuss a way our church is on mission for Jesus in our city or in the world! We will talk about the same group for a whole month, learning about them throughout that month and praying for them.
