

God Knows Everything!

Exodus 32:1-8

Verse to Memorize: Psalm 86:8 There is none like you, O Lord.

Catechism Question: What is God? God is the creator of everyone and everything.

Session	Activity	Materials Needed
Welcome and Greeting	Greet students and discuss their week. Spend time building relationships.	
Music	<p>Share with students that we will be having music time every week. We will be learning a song that helps us remember and learn our lesson. For the next 8 weeks we will be learning the question What is God? We will be singing a song to help us learn the answer to that question!</p> <p>Using New City Catechism App go to Question 2: What is God? Memory Verse Game	Review Memory Verse Psalm 86:8 There is none like you, O Lord. Sing Song that goes along with verse to the tune of "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star"	Memory Verse Song to tune of "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star"
Catechism and Lesson	Review with students that we are on week 5 of our 8 weeks of learning the answer to the question: What is God? God is the creator of everyone and everything. Review that God is the creator of everyone and everything so He	

has special parts of himself that we do not have. Review some of the attributes and motions.

This week we will learn another part of God's character- that he knows everything! Repeat that after me-God knows everything. Now show students the motion that goes with the word by taking your fingers and tapping your head. God knows everything.

Do you know everything? (Tap your head.) NO. We don't know everything. But God knows EVERYTHING!

Open your bible to Exodus 32:1-8 to show students where to find the story of the Israelites Read the following child friendly version.

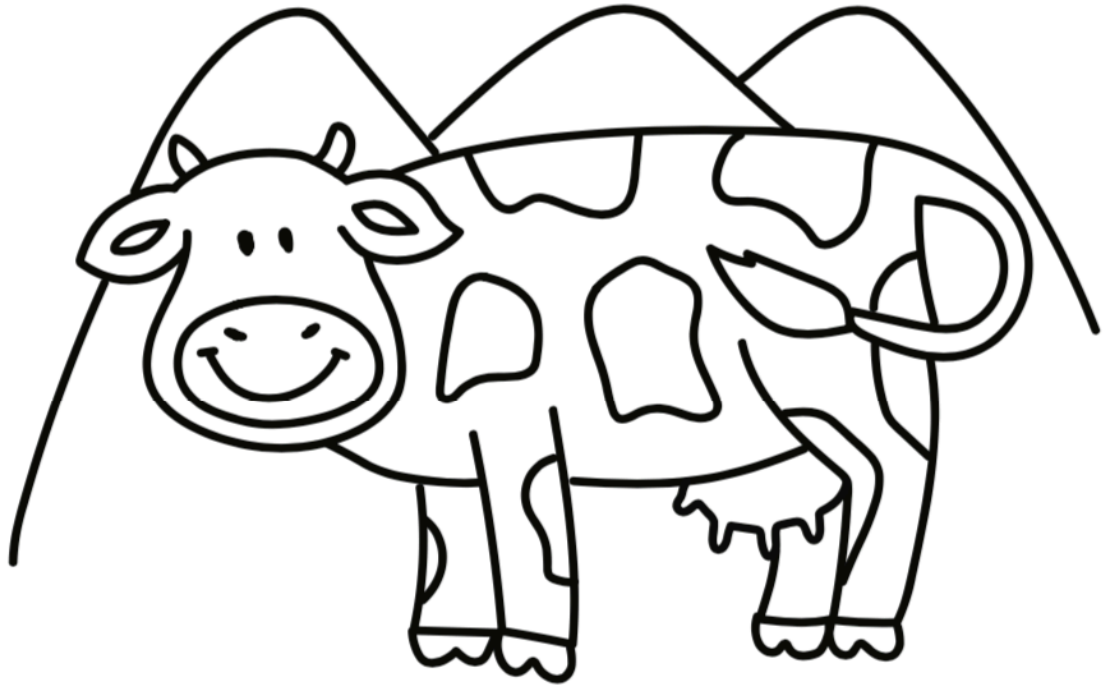
God had just brought the Israelites out of Egypt and they knew he is the one who led them. But Moses, their leader, went up onto the mountain to talk to God and was taking a long time. The people started getting impatient and said, "let's make a god to lead us" so they took their gold and they made a calf to worship. Then they said "These are your gods who brought you from Egypt" and they worshiped the calf"

And God spoke to Moses on the mountain and said "Go, get down there. In no time the people have started worshiping something other than me!"

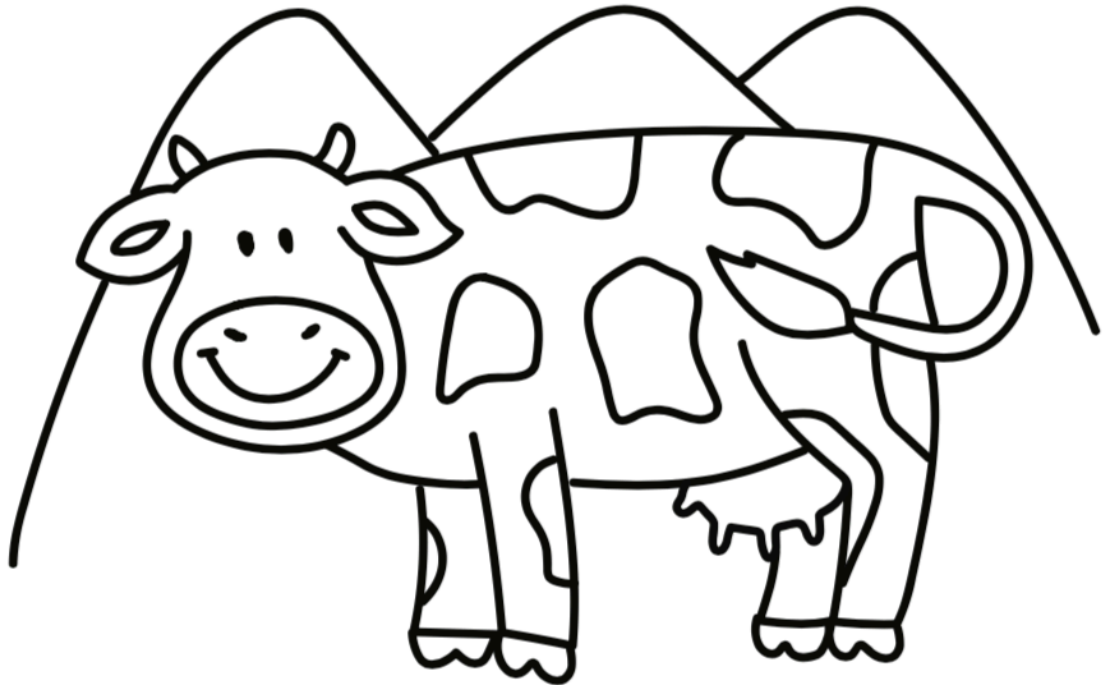
Oh no! God protected the Israelites and look what happened. They chose to show love and worship something else. A golden calf that they made! They forgot how good God was to them. Look at what God told Moses: "Go, Get Down There!" The Israelites were messing up and worshiping other gods, and God knew they were doing that, but that didn't mean he was going to give up on them. Even though God knew they

	were doing something wrong, he still stayed with them and lead them.	
Activity	<p>Golden Calf Craft</p> <p>Give each kid a picture of the golden calf page and read the sentence below. Remind students that God knows everything. He knew the Israelites would sin. He knows we will sin. But he is a good God and he loves us anyway! Allow kids to color the calf.</p>	Golden Calf Page
Closing and Pick Up	<p>Allow students to continue working on activities from the day or free play until parents arrive. Give a five minute timer for pickup before the end of service. This is a great time to play the spotify playlist of worship music or catechism song.</p>
