God has no Limits

Genesis 1:26-2:3

Verse to Memorize: Psalm 86:8 There is none like you, O Lord.

Catechism Question: What is God? God is the creator of everyone and everything.

Session	Activity	Materials Needed
Welcome and Greeting	Greet students and discuss their week. Spend time building relationships.	
Music	<p>Share with students that we will be having music time every week. We will be learning a song that helps us remember and learn our lesson. For the next 8 weeks we will be learning the question What is God? We will be singing a song to help us learn the answer to that question!</p> <p>Using New City Catechism App go to Question 2: What is God? Play Song for Question 2: What is God</p> <p>Lyrics: God is the creator of everyone and everything.</p>	<p>Download APP: New City Catechism</p> 
Memory Verse Game/Activity	Give each student the printout of the memory verse: Psalm 86:8. Allow students to draw or color their memory verse page.	Memory Verse Page
Catechism and Lesson	Discuss with students that over the next 8 weeks they are going to be learning the answer to the question What is God? Each week we will think about the answer to that question: God is the creator of everyone and everything. (Just like in our song!) God is the creator of everyone	

and everything so He has special parts of himself that we do not have. For the next 8 weeks we are going to learn what makes God so special.


This week we are learning about how God has no limits. Say that with me. God has no limits. Each week we will learn a motion to remember our new word to describe God. Take your hands and stretch them as far as you can from left to right, making your arms as WIDE as you can. God has no limits. (repeat the word with the motion a few times and allow students to repeat it to each other.) I wonder what a limit is? Let's think about that. We have certain things we can do and certain things we can't do. Raise your hand if you can jump. Let me see you jump! Raise your hand if you can tap your head. Let me see you tap your head. Hmmm that wasn't your limit. Raise your hand if you can stomp your feet. Stomp them! Hmmm that isn't your limit. Raise your hand if you can fly in the air like a bird. Nobody? Me either? That is a limit for us. We all have things we can do, like stomping our feet, and things we can't do, like flying. But guess what. God has NO LIMITS, (Do the motion.) There is NOTHING God can't do!

Don't take my word for it! Let's read in the bible to hear about how limitless (do motion) God is. Let's listen to see how he has no limits!

Open your bible to Genesis 1:26-2:3 to show students where to find the story of creation. Read the following child friendly version.

God spoke: "Let us make human beings in our image, make them reflecting our nature so they can be responsible for the fish in the sea, the birds in the air, the cattle, and earth itself and every animal on the earth."

	<p>God created human beings; he created reflecting God's nature.</p> <p>He created them to be boy and girl. God blessed them: He told them to fill the earth and take charge. "Be responsible for fish in the sea and birds in the air, for every living thing that moves on the face of Earth."</p> <p>Then God said, "I've given you every sort of plant on Earth and every kind of fruit-bearing tree, for food. To all animals and all birds, everything that moves and breathes, I give whatever grows out of the ground for food."</p> <p>And there it was. God looked over everything he had made; it was so good, so very good!</p> <p>It was evening, it was morning— Day Six.</p> <p>Heaven and Earth were finished, down to the last detail. By the seventh day God had finished his work. On the seventh day he rested from all his work.</p> <p>Wow! How many of you have ever created something? Did you have a limit to what you created, or did you ever have to stop? What stopped you? Discuss with students the meaning of a limit and the types of things that stop us. Resources, time, space. Now look back on the story of creation. What stopped God? Nothing. He created earth and plants and animals and humans out of nothing and nothing stopped him.</p> <p>Let's pray and thank God for having no limits. He is such a big God!</p>	
Activity	<p>Give students pre-prepared paper plate with ring drawn around middle and the takeaway point glued on: God has no limits. He created heaven and earth. Genesis 1</p> <p>Give students blue dot pens and allow them to dot the sky/heavens in their circle.</p>	<p>-Paper plates -Blue dot markers -Green dot markers -Takeaway Point</p> <p>Example:</p>

	<p>Give students green dot pens and allow them to dot the grass in their circle.</p> <p>Talk about who made the heavens and the earth. God did. God can create the heavens and the earth because there is no limit to what God can do!</p>	
Closing and Pick Up	<p>Allow students to continue working on activities from the day or free play until parents arrive. Give a five minute timer for pickup before the end of service. This is a great time to play the spotify playlist of worship music or catechism song.</p>
