

Verse to Memorize: Psalm 86:8 There is none like you, O Lord.

Catechism Question: What is God? God is the creator of everyone and everything.

Session	Activity	Materials Needed
Welcome and Greeting	Greet students and discuss their week. Spend time building relationships.	
Music	<p>Share with students that we will be having music time every week. We will be learning a song that helps us remember and learn our lesson. For the next 8 weeks we will be learning the question What is God? We will be singing a song to help us learn the answer to that question!</p> <p>Using New City Catechism App go to Question 2: What is God? Play Song for Question 2: What is God</p> <p>Lyrics: God is the creator of everyone and everything.</p>	<p>Download APP: New City Catechism</p> 
Memory Verse Game/Activity	<p>Memory Verse Toss</p> <p>Have students sit in a circle. Say Psalm 86:8 aloud and then together as a group: There is none like you, O Lord.</p> <p>Hold the toss object in your hand and explain that students will hold the toss object (bean bag or ball) and say one word of the verse. You will help each other if they don't remember! They will then pass the object to the right in the circle and the next person will say the next word. Keep slowly passing and saying until you say all of the words! Repeat as many times as time allows!</p>	Bean Bag or ball

	<p>Next week is our last week with our memory verse! Remind students to practice at home.</p>	
<p>Catechism and Lesson</p>	<p>Discuss with students that they are going to continue learning the answer to the question What is God? God is the creator of everyone and everything. God is the creator of everyone and everything so He has special parts of himself that we do not have. Does anyone remember the part of Himself we learned about over the past few weeks? Allow students to share and do motions they remember!</p> <p>This week we are learning about how God is in all places. He is everywhere. Show students the new motion by starting with your hands together and then opening them to motion around you. Repeat that God is everywhere and do the motion, allowing students to repeat with you. Have students show the motion to a friend next to them.</p> <p>Do you believe that God is everywhere? Don't take my word for it! Let's read in the bible to hear about how God is everywhere (do motion.</p> <p>Open your bible to Deuteronomy 31:1-8 to show students where to find the story of Israelites. Read the following child friendly version.</p> <p>Moses had been leading the Israelites through the desert but was very old. He looked at them and said, "I'm 120 years old today. I can't walk like I used to. And GOD told me, 'You're not going to cross this Jordan River.'</p> <p>"GOD, your God, will cross the river ahead of you and keep you safe (And Joshua will cross the river before you, as GOD said he would.) GOD will give you the land.</p> <p>"Be strong. Take courage. Don't be scared because GOD, your God, is going ahead of you. He's right there with you. He won't let you down; he won't leave you."</p>	

	<p>Then Moses talked to Joshua. He said to him with all Israel watching, "Be strong. Be brave. You will enter the land with this people, this land that God promised them. God is going ahead of you. He's right there with you. He won't let you down; he won't leave you. Don't be scared. Don't worry."</p> <p>The Israelites are the same ones who were rescued out of Egypt, the same ones God gave Manna to. Notice what God kept repeating to them. "God is going ahead of you. He's right there with you." God was promising them that He would go ahead of them and get things ready, but he would also stay and protect them. He gave them that promise so they would know that they were taken care of. And that is a promise he gives us. He is everywhere at once. HE goes ahead of us and gets things ready for us but he also stays right here with us and takes care of us. What a beautiful promise from God!</p> <p>Let's pray and thank God that He is everywhere at once.</p>	
<p>Missional Moment</p>	<p>Discuss how each week we will have a missional moment where we discuss a way our church is on mission for Jesus in our city or in the world! We are continuing to learn about Bryan and Mary Macias who are on mission in Southeast Asia. Use the pictures included to review our missional moment of the month. This week we will be taking videos to send to the Macias family. They are very far away, and seeing faces of Vintage Kids supporting them and encouraging them will cheer them on! As a class choose a few students to speak on video about why you are thankful for their ministry and how you have been praying for them. We will combine the videos and send them next week!</p> <p>*Email your videos to your children's lead after service, and he or she will pass them along!</p>	
<p>Activity</p>	<p>God Compass:</p> <p>Pass out compass and arrow to each child and have children add decorations to compass with crayons or</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Print copies of worksheet on white copy paper and cut

	<p>markers. Attach arrow to center of compass with brad. Tie string to compass to create a necklace. Remember to write child's name on craft. Remind children God is everywhere at once.
